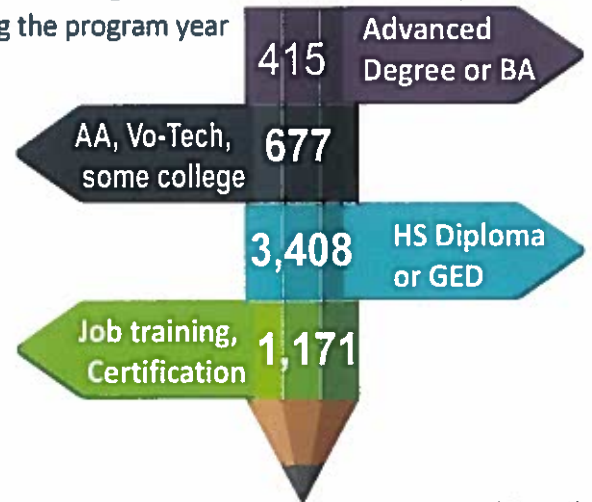

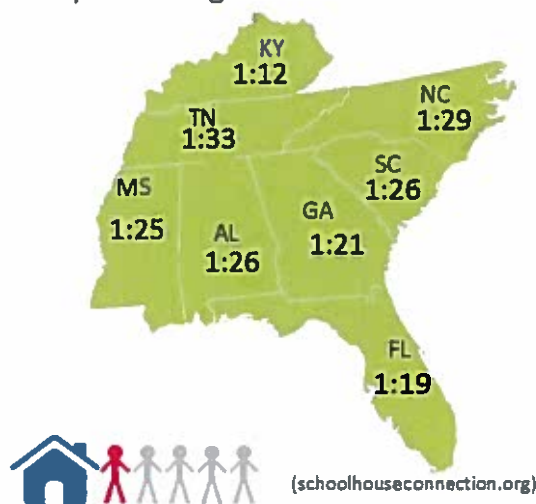

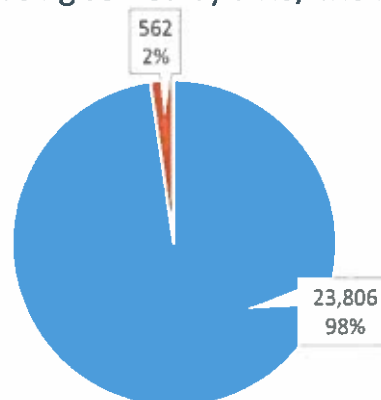

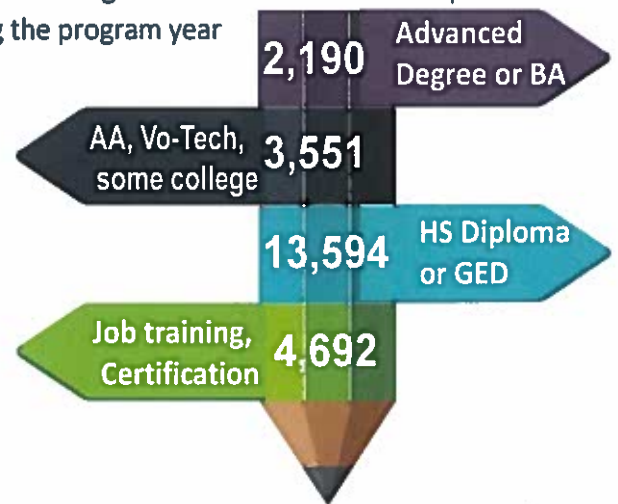

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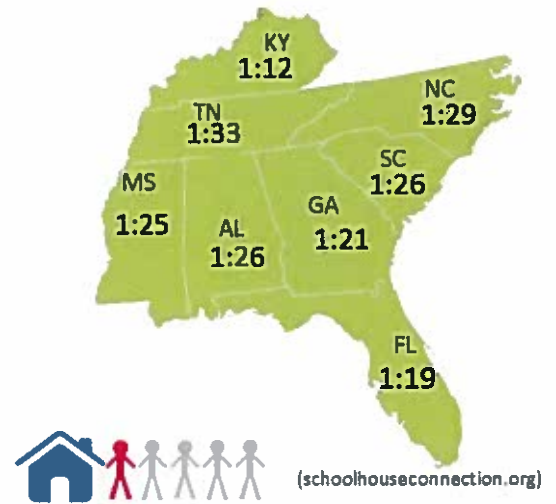

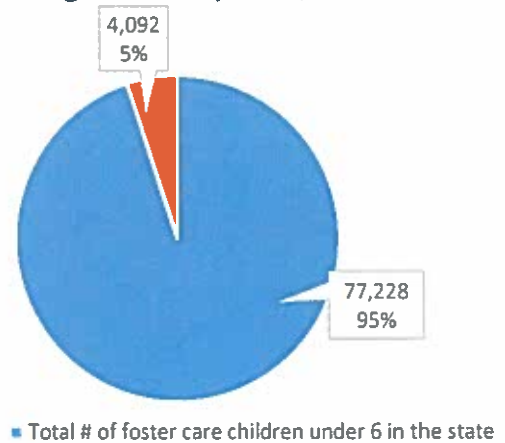

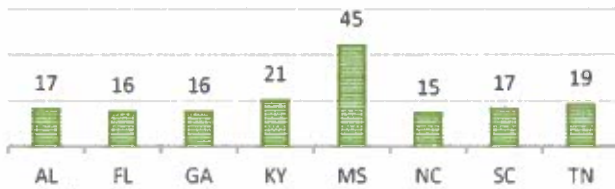

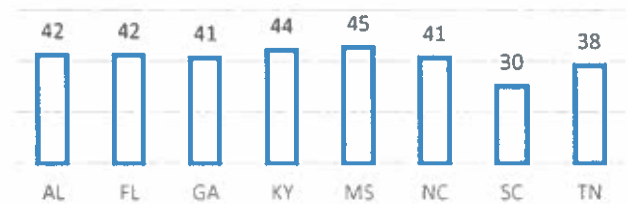

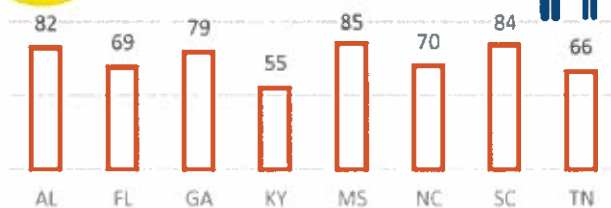

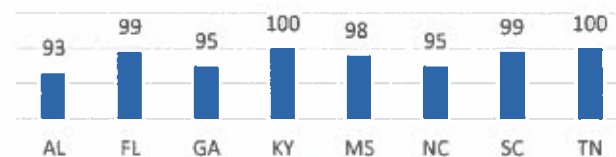

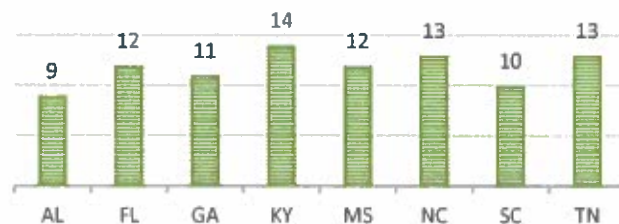

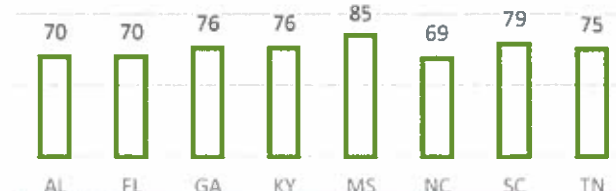

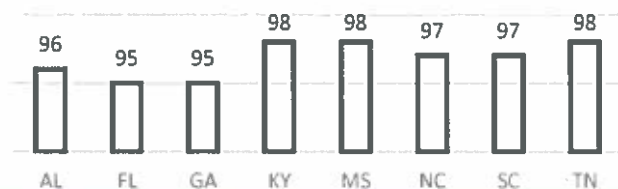

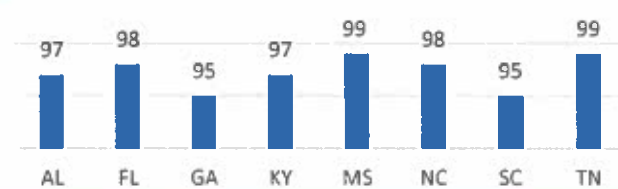

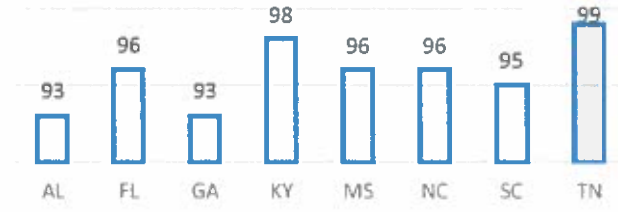

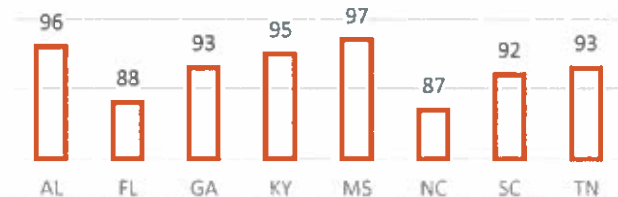

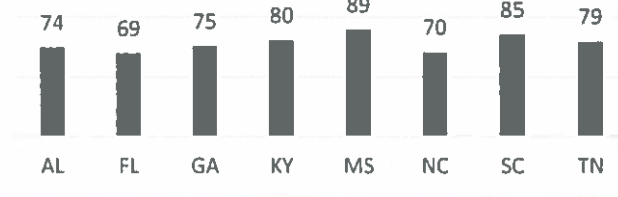

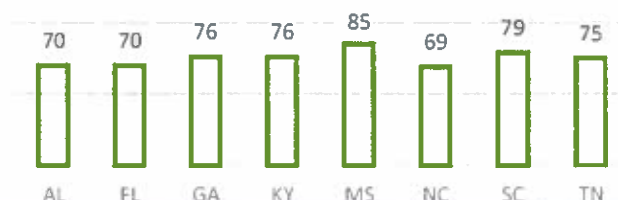

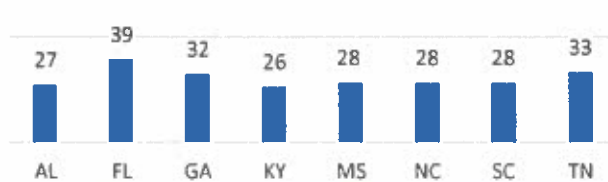
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Homeless and Foster Care - 2018

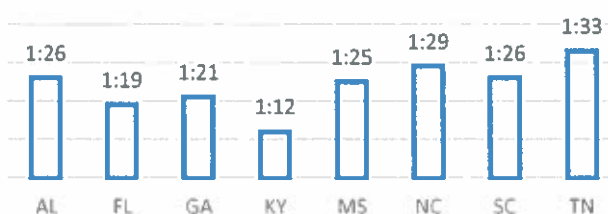

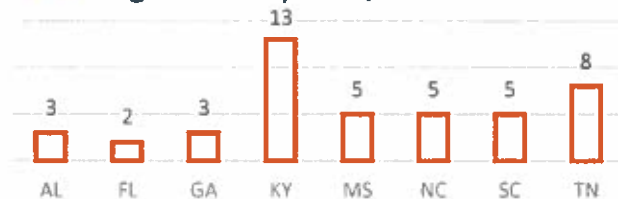

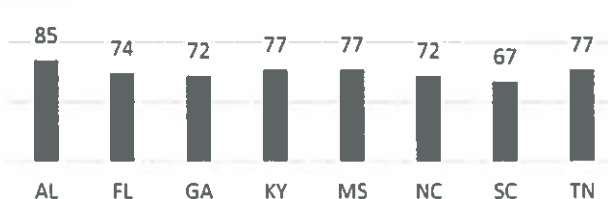
