- Legislative committee weeks began during the month of December and ran through February

As Florida enters its 2025 Legislative Session, here are the bills we were tracking

HB21/SB82 Dental Therapy

Authorizes Medicaid to reimburse for dental services provided by certain mobile dental units; creates Council on Dental Therapy; specifies licensure requirements, services, limitations, & prohibitions relating to practice of dental therapy; requires DOH, in consultation with Board of Dentistry & AHCA, to submit reports to Legislature. (House, 1st Reading on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 8:00 PM. Senate: 03/04/25 S Introduced on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 6:54 PM)

HB 47/ SB 738: (Similar bills) Child Care and Early Learning Providers - Recently Added
Revises licensing standards for child care facilities; child care personnel; minimum standards; child care regulation; & large family child care homes. (House: 1st Reading on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 8:01 PM;

Senate, 03/04/25 S Introduced on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 6:54 PM)

HB191/ SB70: (Identical bills) Instructional Hours for the Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program - Recently Added

Revises instructional hours required to be delivered in Voluntary Prekindergarten Education Program for school-year & summer programs. Strikes 540 instructional Hours and moves to at provide at least 1,440. (House: 1st Reading on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 8:00 PM; Senate, 03/04/25 S Introduced on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 6:54 PM)

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HB859 | SB 1382 (Similar): School Readiness Program Access to School Readiness Programs for Economically Disadvantaged Households- Updated with a companion bill

Revises provisions relating to school readiness program. A child from birth to the beginning of the school year for which the child is eligible for admission to kindergarten in a public school under s. 1003.21(1)(a)2. who is from a working family that is economically disadvantaged, greater than 50 percent, but less than 65 percent, of the state median income. (House, 1st Reading on Tuesday, March 4, 2025 Senate: 03/10/25 Introduced on Monday, March 10, 2025)

HB877/SB1102 (Idential): School Readiness Program

Revises criteria for child to receive priority for participation in school readiness program; & provides requirements for school readiness program provider to be eligible for specified funding.(i.e., "reimbursement rates). (House, 1st Reading on Tuesday, March 4, 2025; Senate,03/04/25 S Introduced on Tuesday, March 4, 2025)

SB 112:/HB 591: Children with Developmental Disabilities

Revising the scope of the Dr. and Mrs. Alfonse and Kathleen Cinotti Health Care Screening and Services Grant Program to include autism-related services. Updating the Early Steps Program grant application to align with new regulations. Establishing the Early Steps Extended Option, with the Department of Health authorized to implement it without federal funding. Requiring the University of Florida Center for Autism and Neurodevelopment to fund specialized summer programs for children with autism spectrum disorder. (Senate - 3/10/2025 CS/CS by Fiscal Policy read 1st time House -03/04/25 S CS by Education Pre-K - 12 read 1st time on Tuesday, March 4, 2025)

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HB 1623 | SB1780 - Early Education Workforce Support - Recently Added
Establishes Early Education Workforce Support Pilot Program within DOE for two years to provide free early education services to eligible children of early education workers in two counties; provides program requirements. (House- 3/5/2025 Now in Careers & Workforce Subcommittee Senate- 3/10/2025 - Introduced)

SB 1306 - Exemption from Ad Valorem Taxes of Child Care Facilities- Recently Added
Exempting from ad valorem taxes any portion of property used as a child care facility that has achieved
Gold Seal Quality status; requiring that the lessor child care facility operator be considered eligible to derive
the benefit of the exemption upon a specified demonstration, etc. (House- 03/10/25 S Introduced on
Monday, March 10, 2025)
