- Legislative committee weeks began during the month of December and ran through February

As Florida enters its 2025 Legislative Session, here are the bills we were tracking

HB21/SB82 Dental Therapy

Authorizes Medicaid to reimburse for dental services provided by certain mobile dental units; creates Council on Dental Therapy; specifies licensure requirements, services, limitations, & prohibitions relating to practice of dental therapy; requires DOH, in consultation with Board of Dentistry & AHCA, to submit reports to Legislature. (House, Now in Health & Human Services Committee, 02/14/2024; Senate, 01/15/25 S Referred to Health Policy; Appropriations Committee on Health and Human Services; Rules on Wednesday, January 15, 2025)

HB859: School Readiness Program

Revises provisions relating to school readiness program. A child from birth to the beginning of the school year for which the child is eligible for admission to kindergarten in a public school under s. 1003.21(1)(a)2. who is from a working family that is economically disadvantaged, greater than 50 percent, but less than 65 percent, of the state median income. (House, Filed on Thursday, February 20, 2025 4:37 PM)

HB877/SB1102: School Readiness Program

Revises criteria for child to receive priority for participation in school readiness program; & provides requirements for school readiness program provider to be eligible for specified funding.(i.e., "reimbursement rates). (House, Filed on Friday, February 21, 2025 2:05 PM; Senate, 02/25/25 S Filed on Tuesday, February 25, 2025 8:04 AM)

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SB 112:/HB 591: Children with Developmental Disabilities

Revising the scope of the Dr. and Mrs. Alfonse and Kathleen Cinotti Health Care Screening and Services Grant Program to include autism-related services. Updating the Early Steps Program grant application to align with new regulations. Establishing the Early Steps Extended Option, with the Department of Health authorized to implement it without federal funding. Requiring the University of Florida Center for Autism and Neurodevelopment to fund specialized summer programs for children with autism spectrum disorder. (2/21/2025 Senate - Now in Fiscal Policy; 2/19/2025 House - Now in Student Academic Success Subcommittee)
