On February 1, 2021, The U.S. Department of Health and Human Services (HHS), the Office of the Assistant Secretary for Planning and Evaluation has prepared new poverty guidelines to determine Head Start and Early Head Start programs' income eligibility. Program staff is encouraged to refer to these resources when working with families.

### **New Acting Director of the Office of Head Start (OHS)**


January 13, 2021, marked Dr. Deborah Bergeron's last day as Director of the Office of Head Start.
