

### **Principles for Rebuilding Early Learning Sector**

- 1. Stabilize and rebuild the early education and care landscape with an emphasis on quality providers.
- 2. Support low income families served in the School Readiness Program.
- 3. Close/remediate achievement gaps for rising kindergarten students.
- Redirect Preschool Development Grant (PDG) funds, as appropriate, to support families, providers and communities.
- 5. Provide coalitions with local flexibility, as appropriate, to leverage local partnerships and resources.
- 6. Enhance workforce through incentives to increase and improve their skills, competency and professionalism.





### **OEL's Response to COVID-19**

- Continuous contact with coalitions and providers

#### Stabilize and Rebuild

- Paid providers based on enrollment as opposed to attendance.
- Prioritized and increased access to child care services for children of first responders and health care workers.
- Provided mini-grants for infrastructure and cleaning supply costs and teacher stipends for continued training.
- Provided Emergency Child Care Relief Grants and High-Quality Reopening Grants statewide to both contracted and non-contracted providers.





### Financial Support to Low Income Families Served

- Eliminated terminations of SR child care services.
- Provided flexibility for SR child care eligibility.
- Extended timelines for submission of paperwork.
- Waived required SR parent copayments.





#### Results

• \$151M— Funding to date to support Florida's child care providers and their families (Child Care and Development Fund and CARES Act).

• Steady and significant drop in closures of School Readiness/VPK providers, from a high of 58% in mid-April 2020, to 16.2% as of July 15, 2020.





### **CARES Act Grants: Phase I and Phase II**

#### **Allocation Methodology**

- Choose April 30<sup>th</sup> as the date for determining status of providers: open or closed
- Used DCF/EFS Mod combined file of ~12,000 providers
- Coalitions reviewed the file
- OEL included additional funding to coalitions to provide grants to omitted eligible providers


