### News from the National Level

#### Increased Funding for Head Start Announced

On May 4, 2017 Congress passed an \$85 million increase to Head Start and Early Head Start funding for Fiscal Year 2017. The bill will now go to the president for his signature.

The increase of \$85 million is allocated specifically to support the Head Start and Early Head Start workforce through a cost-of-living adjustment, including the Early Head Start expansion and Child Care partnerships.

### Legislative Activities at the State Level

As we wrap up the final week of Florida's 2017 Legislative Session, there are a few items that have come to our attention that may be of interest to you.

**ELC Legislative Update:** The Florida House kept School Readiness, CCEP, VPK and the Performance Funding Program at the same funding level. The Senate kept SR, PFP & CCEP the same and increased funding for VPK by nearly \$17m. The proposed budget raises the VPK Base Student Allocation (BSA) from \$2,437 to \$2,529 per student, which is the highest level in the last seven years.

The House introduced some proviso language calling for OEL to present the legislature with a plan to reduce the total number of coalitions from 30 to 25. The motivation is to reduce duplication and find economies of scale. Lindsay Carson, CEO, Early Learning Coalition of Pinellas County, Inc. stated "it is very unlikely that Pinellas would be impacted by any proposed mergers. We are the 7th largest coalition in the state. I believe they will be focused on coalitions serving less than 2000-2500 children in SR annually (we serve over 6000 on average). Our surrounding coalitions serve larger numbers of children as well".

**The Early Learning Performance Funding Project** is funded in both House and Senate, however each had different proviso language. Modified proviso language regarding PFP has been agreed upon, adding the following sentence: "The funds will be administered by the Office of Early Learning in coordination with the Early Learning Coalitions to provide consistent standards and leverage community efforts to support a coordinated statewide system of quality."

#### Congressman Crist Visits Connie L. Marmaro Head Start Center

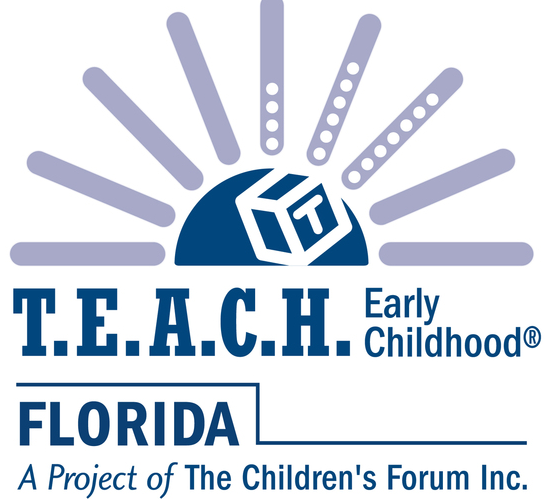

### Information You Can Use

#### May 17 Public Session of the NAS Committee on Financing

An ad hoc committee under the auspices of the National Academies of Sciences, Engineering, and Medicine will study how to fund early care and education for children from birth to kindergarten entry that is accessible, affordable to families, and of high quality, including a well-qualified and adequately supported workforce consistent with the vision outlined in the report **Transforming the Workforce for Children Birth Through Age 8.**

#### BUILDing Supportive Communities with Libraries, Museums, and Early Childhood Systems

This toolkit is the result of a yearlong collaboration between the BUILD Initiative and the Institute of Museum and Library Services. Working in five pilot states (Arizona, Georgia, Michigan, Pennsylvania, and Washington) that are members of BUILD's learning community, the project convened leaders from museums, libraries, and early childhood systems to learn together and discuss ways to collaborate.

### FHSA Gets Social

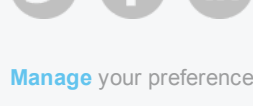
